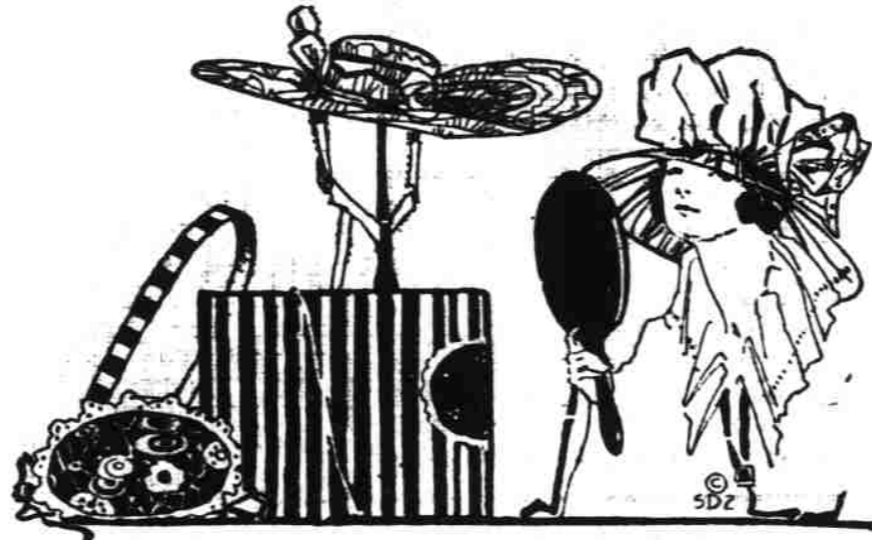

AMERICAN INDIANS LOST TRIBES OF ISRAEL

(By United Press.) Berkeley, Cal., March 30.—The theory that the American Indians are members of the lost tribes of Israel was given added proof here today

when Dr. E. W. Gifford, of California university's anthropology department, announced his discovery of similarities and practices between the Kwalisu Indians of the Kern River section and the ancient Hebrews.

The Hebrews, according to the Bible, held that if a man died without offspring, his brother should marry the widow, and the first-born of that union should be known as the dead man's child. The Kwalisu Indians observe the same custom.

Must Have Passports to Enter Spain.

(By United Press.) Madrid, March 30.—All aliens found in Spain, beginning Sunday, who have no passports, will be subject to fine and expulsion. No aliens will be permitted to enter Spain without a passport after Sunday. At that time also a systematic registration of all aliens will be undertaken. This measure is taken because the country has been overrun with spies, a small army of whom have been keeping submarine

captains informed as to the sailing of all vessels from Spanish ports.

ONE YEAR AGO IN THE WAR. March 30, 1916.—Italians and Austrians engaged in severe battle at Gorizia; official report of the sinking of the Franco-Russian hospital ship in Black Sea, with loss of nearly 100 lives; allies reported discovery of four German and Austrian submarine bases among the Greek islands.

Canda Has Large Surplus. Ottawa, Ont., March 30.—After paying off all current indebtedness, including interest on all war expenditures and all pensions, there will be \$50,000,000 left in the Dominion treasury at the close of the fiscal year tomorrow, to assist in paying off a portion of the capital expenditure incurred during the war. The year's revenues amount to \$230,000,000, which is \$50,000,000 more than last year, and \$100,000,000 more than for the first year of the war.
