ALABAMA TEACHERS' NOW IN MEETING Montgomery, Ala., April 5.—The thirty-sixth annual convention of the Alabama Education Association began its sessions at the Grand Theatre, this city, this afternoon, with an attendance of several thousand visiting teachers, the largest in the history of the association. The opening session was given over to addresses of welcome by Governor Charles Henderson and W. T. Robertson, President of the city educational commission, with a response by Superintendent P. W. Hodges, of Dothan. Following the exchange of greetings the convention listened to the address of the retiring president, Dr. James J. Doster, of the University of Alabama, in which he reviewed the work of the association and made several suggestions in regard to its future activities. The general sessions and departmental meetings of the convention will be continued over tomorrow and Saturday. Among the noted educators on the program are Dr. P. P. Claxton, United States Commissioner of Education; Dr. Thornehill Hayes, president of Birmingham College; Dr. Charles H. Judd, of the University of Chicago; and Dr. H. L. Whitfield, president of the Mississippi Industrial Institute.

NOT ENOUGH NAMES ON BOND PETITION Robeson Voters to Make Another Trial to Secure Road Funds. (Special to The Dispatch.) Lumberton, N. C., April 5.—Petitions presented to the board of county commissioners asking that an election be called to vote on whether Robeson county should borrow \$300,000 a year for six years from the State for road building purposes under the Clark act, did not have the requisite number of signatures and another meeting will be necessary. The law requires that 25 per cent. of the registered voters of a county must petition for an election. According to that, about 1,800 names will be necessary in this county. A special meeting of the board of county commissioners has been called for Thursday to receive the petitions.

NEWSBOYS UP ON CURRENT EVENTS. (By United Press.) Chicago, April 5.—College students may be past masters of Latin and Greek, but on current events they're back numbers compared with the peddler of "poopers" on the city's streets. In an experimental demonstration conducted by Prof. Herbert Willett on "past and current" topics, less than 50 per cent. of Chicago University's cultured ones answered the questions correctly. Gerard, unattached ambassador, was designated as a "good smoke," a German taking a keen interest in the war. Lloyd-George was credited by one student with being "the king of England." Zimmerman, German minister of foreign affairs, was accused of being both a "prize fighter" and a "baseball player." Patrick Henry wasn't even mentioned as the originator of the "Give me liberty or give me death" national byword. Nathan Hale and Henry Clay were favorites. The Chinese prince was everything from a "southern secret society" to an "Indiana reformer."
