Later lightness of offerings led to a decided rally in wheat that in some cases more than overcame the previous decline. Renewed corn strength and the high price being paid by mills for cash wheat were bullish factors. The close was unsettled at 3 cents decline to 1-4 cent advance, with May at 2.06 1/4 to 2.07 1/4 and July at 1.82 1/8 to 1.83 3/8.

STOCKS.

New York, April 10 (Wall Street).—Selling of the general list was resumed at the opening of today's market, specialties recording greatest losses. Trading was largely of professional origin, but signs of further public liquidation was evident in some of the standard or representative issues.

With the exception of Delaware and Hudson the loss was increased to more than six points. Ralls made further gains in the afternoon under leads of Pacifics and Coalters. Industrials and active specialties also hardened.
