IN RE CARNIVALS.

Says the Greensboro Record, apropos of a question in general and appropriate in detail to one locally: "In Wilmington a carnival was to give an exhibition and the gate receipts were to be split between the managers and the band association.

"But the Merchants' Association said the carnival always hurts business; that it should not be allowed, and on top of this the Ministerial Association came in and said the carnival always hurt the morals of a community and it should not be tolerated.

But, perhaps, Greensboro has not had the multiplicity of carnivals that Wilmington has had, or has not stopped to reason as has this city. We still believe, just as we have for years, that the carnival is not even a "necessary evil," and it is a matter of gratification that the people of Wilmington seem to have all agreed on the proposition that it will be better for the city to have carnivals remain away.

In the first place, the carnival always presents many games of chance, such games as would not be tolerated if conducted by people at home.

So the carnival is really illegal, in our opinion, as well as a discrimination, in the former light, and absolutely useless for amusement in the second phase.

If it is contended that a person has a right to spend his money like he pleases and that temptation should not be kept out of the path, and these are admitted, for argument sake, the carnival falls by the weight of the status just stated and which must be generally admitted.

City Council did a good day's work when it barred carnivals and the spirit evinced by the band that, following only in the footsteps of other organizations, had arranged for a carnival, was fine.
