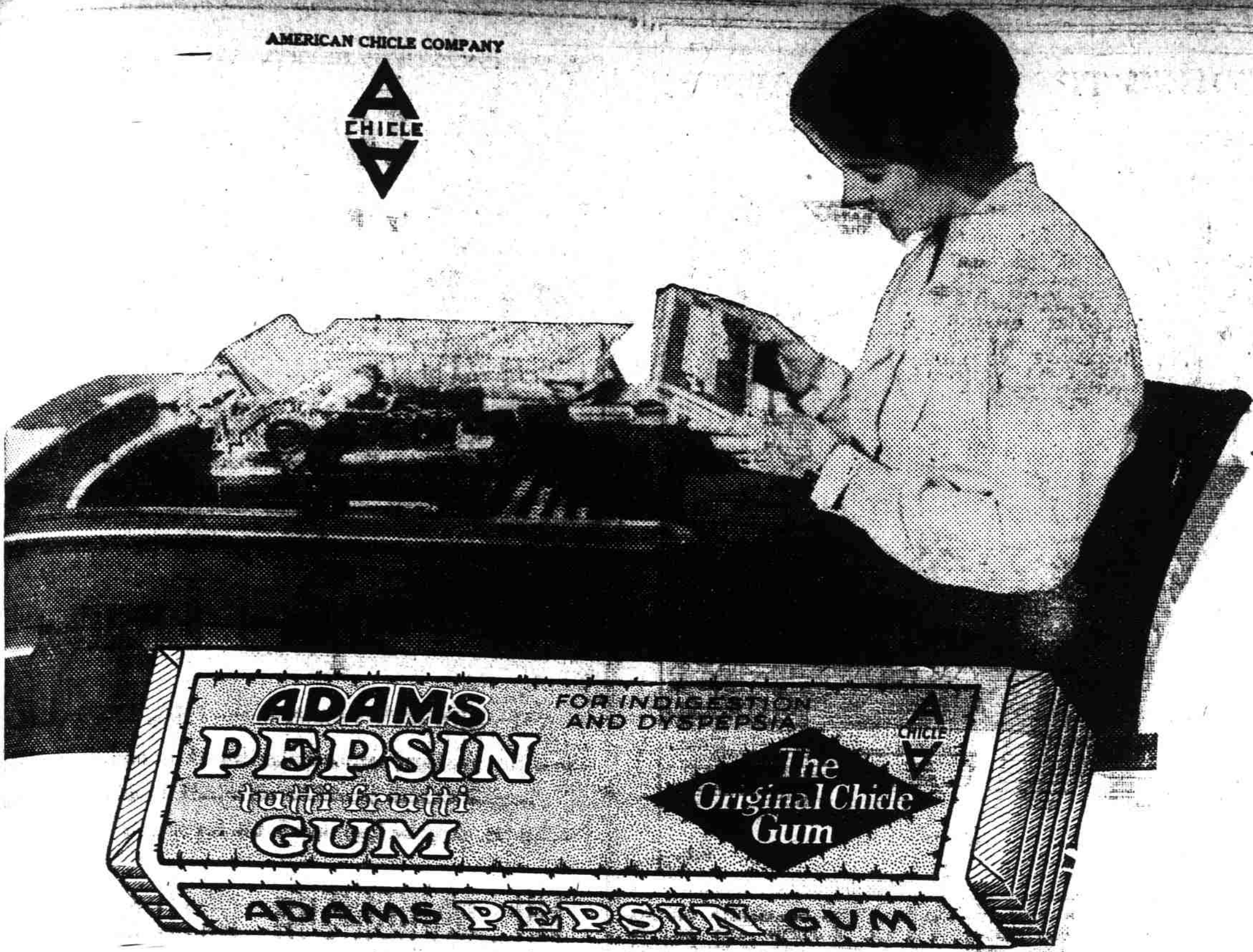

In Raleigh, three of the National banks, the Merchants, the Citizens and the Commercial, have agreed to close, as does the Wake Savings. The others are expected to come in. Only Raleigh and Winston-Salem have as towns announced their purpose to devote the day to selling bonds, but many others doubtless will.

Oregon Votes on Big Bond Issue. Portland, Ore., June 4.—At today's special election in Oregon a number of measures passed by the last Legislature are submitted to the electorate for their endorsement or rejection. Most important centers in the proposal for a \$6,000,000 bond issue for road construction and improvements. Other measures to be passed upon by the voters deal with questions of assessment and taxation, the duration of the legislative session and an increase in the pay of its members, and a proposal that all primary and general elections, both State and municipal, shall be held on the same day.
