That Country Supplied With Large Amount Through Italian Ports

(By Associated Press.) Boston, June 4. - Germany has been supplied with American cotton through Italian trader according to a report of an investigating committee of the National Association of Cotton Manufacturers, which was made public last night. The report advocates government control of shipments of cotton and its products from this country, adding that "could such a step have been taken three years ago it would have materially lessened the length of the war.

"No shipments of raw cotton are being made to Denmark," the report says, "but during the eight months ended in February of the present year, there were shipped to the Netherlands.
