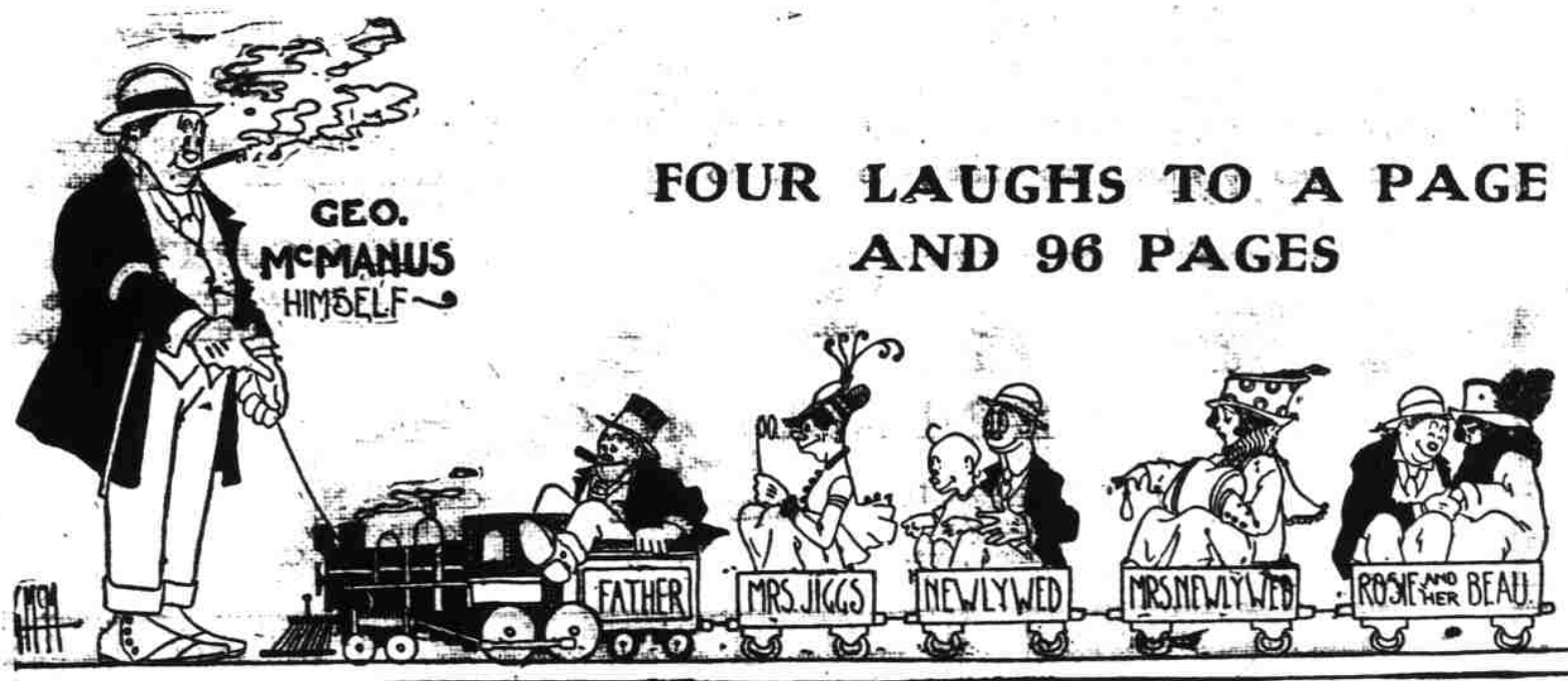

PEOPLE HONOR THE "FATHER OF HAWAII"

Honolulu, June 14.—Unusually elaborate and interesting was Monday observance of the Hawaiian national holiday, known as "Kamehameha Day" in honor of the memory of Kamehameha the Great, the Hawaiian sovereign who conquered the islands and consolidated them under one government more than a century ago, and who is styled by historians as the "Napoleon of the Pacific."

In pursuance of a custom inaugurated several years ago the celebration this year takes the form of a grand popular carnival and will be extended through the greater part of the week. Floral parades, historical pageants, international polo tournament and elaborate series of aquatic sports and competitions are to be included in the program.

Today's festivities begin with a parade of Hawaiian societies this morning and conclude this evening with elaborate pageant in the old park grounds depicting incidents in the ancient history of Hawaii.

The great statue of Kamehameha which stands in front of the judicial building, was bedecked today with great leis, or wreaths, of flowers during the parade, a detachment of members of one of the older societies stood guard about the statue of the ancient warrior. The guards were usually picturesque in their wonderful feather robes of ancient times, carrying royal "kahilis," "tabis" and other symbols of the Alii, or chieftains.

At the conclusion of the parade the marchers gathered about the statue where a brief song was sung and addresses delivered in Hawaiian explanatory of the achievements of "Great King." Former Queen Liliuokalani, together with the governor and other civil officials of the islands and officers of the United States army and navy, were among the interested spectators at these ceremonies.

Kamehameha the First, so to speak, was Hawaiians from the United States. Speakers refer to him as the "Father of His Country" and to him to the immortal President of the United States. Aside from conquering the islands, he encouraged agriculture and the industries among his subjects. A firm believer in Christianity, he is credited with having sown the seeds of religion throughout his dominions.
