ROTARIANS ARE DETERMINED TO SOLVE PROBLEM

Want to Know Why the Cape Fear River Cannot Be Bridged.

TO INVESTIGATE THE OPPOSITION

Rotarian MacMillan, Also County Commissioner, Asked to Explain Matter By Brother Rotarians.

Once again there is to be a movement made for a modern bridge uniting Wilmington and Brunswick and the Wilmington Rotary Club is to occupy the front-line trenches in the fight.

Rotarian MacMillan, in his talk, explained that it has been estimated by Mr. A. D. O'Brien, civil engineer, and Mr. W. W. Love, of the Wilmington Iron Works, that a reinforced concrete bridge, with a 300-foot double steel lift, can be erected over the river at Orange street for less than \$130,000.

Rotarian MacMillan stated that the bridge would cost about \$150,000, together with the purchase of the present ferry would cost approximately \$200,000.

Rotarian MacMillan stated that in his opinion a vote would have to be taken on either the bridge or ferry proposition, but he stated that he thought that the question of whether the government would allow a bridge, the cost of a structure, and what the Market street site should be, should be thoroughly looked into.

A committee was appointed to make plans for a gathering of the boys and girls of the county, to be held in the city at some future date, at which time the young folks could tell the Rotary Club what they are doing in the way of raising crops and live stock.
