



## A BIG JOB FEEDING THE NATIONAL ARMY

Washington, D. C., Oct. 8.- Approxmately 2,500 carloads of food and other necessities are being delivered laily by the railroads at the cantonnents where the New Naval Army and he National Guard are being trained 'or service abroad, according to reports just veceived by the Railroads' War Board. Accurate figures as to the extent to which the supplying of food and neessities for the soldiers at the trainng camps will intensify the transporation problem will not be available intil all of the camps have received heir full quota of men. The task which the railroads have een asked to perform, however, is a lifficult one. It involves the supplying of all the necessities of life for sixteen 10n-productive cities of a population of '0,000 each and fifty-six smaller cities ranging in population from 300 to 3,-Altogether more than a million men zathered at the various cantonments nust have their daily necessities prought to them by the railroads. As t takes at least five pounds of food per day for each soldier in addition to he clothing; fuel and other supplies that are constantly needed, the railroads have their work cut out for


