WORLD PEACE NOT YET DECLINES CHANCELLOR. Hertling Tells Reichstag Not to Have Delusions About the War

Copenhagen, Monday, March 18.—"Germany should not indulge in delusions that world peace has been accomplished yet," Count von Hertling, the Imperial Chancellor, declared in concluding his speech in the Reichstag today on the peace treaty with Russia. He added: "There is not the slightest inclination yet perceptible among the Entente states to terminate this terrible war. We, however, shall not lose faith. We are prepared and everything is ready. THORNWELL HAYNES RETURNS TO POST. Stockholm, Monday, March 18.—Thornwell Haynes, United States consul at Helsingfors, Finland, has returned to his post, according to a report reaching I. N. Morris, the American minister to Sweden. The commander W. S. Crossley, the American naval attaché, and the military attaché and his wife, are at Bjorneborg awaiting an opportunity to leave. The ice conditions along the Finnish coast are so bad that the Swedish government is not willing to send icebreakers there, notwithstanding the request made by Mr. Morris. A considerable number of Americans are said to be wandering about Southern Finland, vainly seeking a chance to get out of the country.

MARTIAL LAW FOR UKRAINE PROVINCES. London, March 20.—The Ukrainian National Council has declared martial law in the provinces of Poltava, Tchernigov and Kharvov, according to a Reuter dispatch from Petrograd. Freight traffic has been resumed on portions of the railway lines near the Baltic, held by the Germans. The Russian Orthodox church has presented a demand that the Russo-German peace treaty prescribe its authority over the Orthodox population in the territories lost through the peace treaty.
