# COURTS MUST SAY IF DORTCH WON PRIMARY

**Feeling Is Bitter Between the** Nominee and Abernethy. Charges Made

(Special to The Dispatch.)  
Raleigh, June 22.—War it shall be until the courts say whether the third district primary selected W. T. Dortch by 189 majority over Charles L. Abernethy.

That is what the Abernethy partisans say of the state board of elections' determination Thursday to stand from behind the returns. The supporters of Mr. Abernethy do not take the ruling gracefully. They had fought long and hard. He is the least upset of them all.

The feeling is uncommonly bitter. It extends even into the republican ranks and perhaps explains the presence of so many in the primary. It is this circumstance more than any solitary aspect of the case that makes the Abernethy men mad. They think the republicans have come in because the popularity of Abernethy threatened the district. The Simmons organization did not wish to see Abernethy in congress, albeit Abernethy seems to have supported Simmons in the 1912 fight. Whether the partisans of Mr. Abernethy regard him eventually the man to take the Simmons measure does not appear. Certainly the growth of the solicitor into one of the formidable figures in that section has carried consternation.

There is a very interesting story going the rounds here today. Friends of the Craven county candidate say many severe things against Frank Thompson, of Onslow. He was a former senator from that county and against him the Abernethy men make many allegations, neglect of the soldiers, indifference to partisanship, threat to put \$100,000 on the republican campaign fund if Abernethy was nominated.

Now, Frank Thompson is a brother of Dr. Cyrus Thompson, the match of Aycock in joint debate, the most entertaining stump speaker produced by the republicans since the days of Thomas Settle, senior, unless Settle, junior, deserves a division of that fame. The word went out a day or two before the primary that if Abernethy received the nomination, Claude R. Wheatley, regular republican nominee, was to come down in favor of Dr. Cyrus Thompson, and Dr. Cy would have made the race for that office independently. There is little doubt that Frank Thompson, who does not believe in supporting your brother if he isn't a democrat, would have backed his brother this time.

So the thing stands today thus: The attorneys seem to be acting on their client's instructions. It is known that as organization democrats Judge J. C. Biggs isn't much for contesting. The court processes are slow. It is barely probable that the courts could reach the litigation and try it out either by jury or by referee in time for the supreme court. That district is among the first to be heard by the highest court. But it all works slowly.

Meanwhile, Abernethy is little inclined to hand the nomination over. He has campaigned much, doubtless too much. Too much appetizer has clogged the appetite. The primary came for him as a great anti-climax. But he declines to be counted out and will fight on.

Mr. Abernethy has turned in his expense account and today was auditing it preliminary to putting the final touches to it. Notwithstanding the vast amount of money that everybody expected it to cost him, he is well within the allowance, it is said, and the Abernethy partisans are willing to match expenses with Colonel Dortch, who chose an entirely new way and found it satisfactory.

Raleigh men in Washington looking after the capital's aviation interests have not been found to verify a story of a \$5,000,000 business referred to in the morning paper of this coming and four weeks ago in these columns. In the earlier chronicle it was announced that Harry Atwood's aviation plant here had turned out a machine that works to the government and its plans. was willing to take this factory away the moment Raleigh ceased to get interested in it. There were plenty of places in the country willing to do something.

Now comes the message that Raleigh may yet get a \$5,000,000 business and that it may manufacture aeroplanes in great shape. The story this morning set Raleigh in hopeful humor. The war is telling on it. The city is sombre, business seems to be good, everybody is at work, but the life of the town has been sent into the army.

The notice of Lieutenant Harry Watson's death recalled a story recently carried from the front in which Lieutenant Watson was picturesquely written up as he stood on a parapet shouting to the American boys: "Stick it to 'em, boys; give 'em hell!"

The young soldier, brother of Mrs. V. C. Moore, wife of the business manager of the News and Observer, was very popular here and the community has been gloomy today. The war department announces a call for 1,000 white men to be trained five days, beginning July 5, for Camp Greenleaf, in general service. There is likewise a requisition for 247 grammar school graduates with some experience along mechanical lines. These will go to Clemson college for a course similar to that taught in the State College of Agriculture and Engineering.

There is a call for general service for colored men, 1,800 of them, to enter July 16. They go to Camp Dix, Maryland. There are 1,700 men likewise to go to Camp Meade, colored soldiers. It is announced in this connection that men cannot volunteer under this draft, the 1918 soldiers who register this year. The navy is yet open to them, but otherwise they must be classified.
