AMERICANS ARE FACING STIFFENED OPPOSITION


With the American Army Northwest of Verdun, Sept. 20 .- (By Associated Press.)-8 p. m.)-The enemy greatly increased his resistance all along the American line today adding his stiffened opposition to the unfavorable weather which impeded the advance by making liason difficult and transportation precarious. The opposition was heavlest on the right and left yet the American extreme left made good progress despite the stiffest kind of fighting against machine guns.

The units to the right, likewise had to contend with heavy machine gun and artillery fire from east of the Meuse. Reports indicate that the enemy is bringing up reserves, which will be in a position to operate in the Meuse-Moselle sector and is concentrating heavy artillery in the woods west of Romagne. Prisoners say that heavy machine guns are being placed along the Kriemheild defense line and in other sectors in this neighborhood.

Who was not thrilled to read of the American soldier who supported a wounded comrade, and fought his way with the little detachment back through the Boches to the American lines?




