## LEGISLATION FOR BERTIE

We will in our next issue give the miscellaneous bills, resolutions, petitions, etc., offered by Mr. Winston. The following refer to Bertie county only.

1. Act to authorize Bertie county to issue bonds and levy a special tax. This is to cover the fusion debt of the last two years.
2. Act to alter the limits of Kelford
3. Act to amend chapter 288, acts of 1895, Public Laws relating to the Spring terms of the Superior Courts of Craven and Bertie. [Does not change time of holding courts but provides for additional weeks in May and November if needed.]
4. An act to increase the number of Commissioners. [Under this G. L. Mardre and T. S. Norfleet were appointed]
5. Act to amend chapter 421 of the Public Laws of 1895, so that the same shall not apply to Bertie. [This repeals the school tax law and does away with the school election in August.]
6. Petition of citizens of Bertie county against repealing chapter 51 acts 1897, relating to fishing nets in Albermarle Sound.
7. Act to amend section 114 of the Code. [This permits the Clerk of the Superior Court to be absent certain Mondays, but he must have a deputy in his place when absent.]
8. Petition of the merchants of Cole-rain against purchase tax.
9. Petition of the merchants and business men of Windsor asking a repeal of the purchase tax.
10. An act to incorporate the town of Hexlena.
11. Petition from citizens of Windsor asking that Jarvis B. Hoggard be placed in the 1st class pension list. [No persons were advanced to the 1st class pension list. Mr. Hoggard will apply to the local board and they will advance him if they approve his petition. This prevented the granting of his petition.]
12. Petition of the citizens of Cole-rain asking for an extension of the town limits.
13. Petition from the citizens of Roxobel asking for a change of town limits.
14. An act to enlarge the corporate limits of Colerain town.
15. Act to enlarge the limits of Roxobel. [This act also revives the charter of the town.]
16. Act regulating the fees for probating and registering crop liens in Bertie, Hertford and Northampton. [This reduces the fees on crop liens from \$1.05 to 65 cents—a saving on each of 50c.]
17. Act to place the name of Sarah E. Brown on the pension roll. [It will go on the next roll which is made up in November.]
18. Act to regulate fishing in Albermarle Sound and amend chapter 245 of Public Laws of 1895. [This allows nets to be fished a distance of 450 yards from the shore from Kaintuck Field to Rock Spring Branch along the shore of Bachelor's Bay.]

## TO BE WITHDRAWN FROM CUBA.

Washington, March 8.—The War Department has decided to withdraw all volunteer troops from Cuba with-out delay, and arrangements for carrying out that purpose were begun today. As fast as the various regiments reach the United States they will be mustered out. According to the present estimates of transport service, all the volunteers will leave Cuba within a month. This action of the department is due principally to the enactment of the Army Reorganization law, which the permits enlistment of a sufficient number of regulars to garrison all territory acquired by the United States as a result of the war with Spain. The first order to carry out the purpose of the War Department was issued today. It provides that the Twelfth New York Volunteers should leave Matanzas, its present station, on the transport Berlin, now en route to Cuba; and be landed at New York city for muster out. This is the last New York regiment to remain in the Federal service. The War Department is inclined to believe that 20,000 regular troops will be sufficient to maintain order in the island.
