**EVERY** MAN CAN WHITE VOTE.

To take from ignorant white men the right to vote would be to insure the full return of the reign of the mob and the reign of riot in North Carolina. It is a lie to intimate that any white man can be or will be deprived of the right to vote in 1900 or 1901. No white man is really distranchised by the amendment. If any white man is ever disfranchised in North Carolina it must be in consequence of his own folly, crime or indifference The article itself does not disfranchise a white man. If a man's father or 12:43 p. m. grandfather could vote in 1867, then any white man in North Carolina can vote now. If he votes now-in 1900 he will vote always. Ex-Senator Jarvis states it correctly in this:

> "Every white man who is a qualified voter now will continue to be as long as he lives, so far as this amendment affects his right to vote. Every young man arriving at full age before January 1, 1908, can register and vote if he puts his name on the registration books before that date and he will continue to be a voter as long as he
