A FAMOUS GEORGIAN ON THE NEGRO.

Sam Jones, the Georgia evangelist writes often for the Atlanta Journal which is probably the best evening paper in all the south.

In his last article, of 26th inst, he says some pointed things as to "the negro losing ground." After reviewing his past in the south, and saying things amusing and sensible and harsh, he says this:

"For the better element and better class of negroes I have always had the profoundest sympathy and respect. I have more respect today for a dirty negro than I have for a dirty white man."

The negro is to blame largely for this state of things, for if the negro had realized that the best white people of the south were his friends, and he had quit gonging with the liquor crowd and let Yankee-Doodle alone he would have been much better off today.

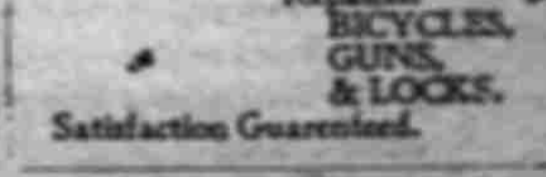
