THE BOERS DO HEAVY FIGHT

London, July 26 .- Lord Roberts reports to the War Office, under date of Balmoral, July, 25, as follows:

"We marched here yesterday withsix miles south of Balmoral, While followed and proposed to cross Oliphant's river to-day at Naauwport. Our casualties were one wounded."

Lord Roberts reports to the War Office to-day that General Archibald Hunter's command was heavily engaged July 24 and 25 in the hills south strongly entrenched and fought stubbornly throughtout the 24th and compelled the British to retire from some of their positions with about fifty casualties. At last accounts General Hunter had worked around into Brandwater basin, in the rear of the Boers, while General Hector McDonald and General Bruce Hamilton were blocking outlets on front of the Federals, who had evacuated their position at Witnek.


