Every interest will be carefully guarded. He will make no parade of his acts to catch popularity. In fact he performs his duty as he sees it quietly and as a matter of course.

When he retires the people will owe him a debt of gratitude they will be quick to pay. He will grow on the people. He will make few mistakes. He is mindful of the people whose servant he is. He is called the Educational Governor. His interest in common school education in all education is natural. He is the product of the Common School Great as is his interest in the schools, it is no greater than his interest in all else that concerns our people in all their walks of life. History will record him a great executive.
