Gov. Aycock has fixed Monday, Nov. 11, as the date for the execution of Drew Vaughan, the colored murderer at Winton, Hertford county.

The September bulletin of the State board of health says that in view of the existence of scarlet fever in a good many counties in North Carolina, it may be worth while to mention the fact which was brought out in discussion on that disease that the peeling of the skin (known as desquamation) from the hands and feet continues longer than from other parts of the body and that it is advisable to disinfect the stockings for a week or two after the patient is discharged from quarantine.

There was a big fire at Hamlet Friday night starting in the second story of the building owned by T. E. Boyd whose loss \$1,500, with \$1,200 insurance. This structure was occupied by the Rock company, stock \$7,000, insurance \$4,200; Covington & Co., stock \$800, insurance \$500; Hamlet Whiskey company, stock \$1,200, insurance \$500; Knights of Pythias loss \$300, insurance \$100; M. D. McDonald's store and resident were burned, loss \$3,400, insurance \$1,100. T. O. Riggan's building was burned, loss \$300.

The advisability of a compulsory school in North Carolina is being discussed by some of the papers of the State. There is much illiteracy in the State, and there are strong arguments in favor of compulsory school attendance but if the parents could be induced to send their children to school with out a compulsory law think it would be better. However, the State has more interest in children than parents who care so little for them as not to send them to school, and there is no other way to get the children to school, there will have to be a compulsory law. Murder and Rapine. Some Horrible Stories of Murder and Rapine Recorded in the Philippine Islands

Horrible stories of murder and rapine are contained in the records of a number of court martial cases in the Philippines copies of which have reached the war department. Five natives seized, bound and carried from their houses the Filipino residents of the town of Pozorznop, together with an Igorrotte harvesters named Quivas. Conveying these captives to an isolated spot then murdered them with bolos and added to the horror of their crime by outraging the women of the families of their victims. The motive for the deed appeared to have been revenge on the part of one of the murderers, because of the fact that the victims had dammed a stream which diverted irrigating waters from the lands of the murderers. All five of the natives were sentenced to be hanged.

A native named Blatin, with one or more companions assassinated with daggers Private J. T. Burgey company C. Twenty sixth Infantry, while the latter was acting as a guard of prisoners hauling water for the garrison stationed at Bareac Neuvo, Pampunay. He was sentenced to be hanged. With a rock, a rice beater and a club one Faustino Ruiz and some of his companions set upon a native named Acasta, whom they suspected of aiding the American cause, and beat him to death. Ruiz was sentenced to be hanged.

Two natives were tried, charged with the murder of Private Eugene R. Lyons, company K, Fifth Infantry, whom they enticed to an isolated place, killed with bolos and buried on the spot. They, too, were sentenced to death. A formidable array of charges was that against Juan Confessor, a native Filipino, who was tried for aiding the enemy, violating the laws of war, being a war rebel, arson and prejury. Twenty years imprisonment at hard labor was the sentence.

A Texas lumber company has entered into a contract to cut timber from a tract of land belonging to the Houston Oil Company. The terms are so unusual as to be worthy of notice. The timber is to be cut at a rate that will require about twenty years to go over the entire tract. Trees smaller than a foot in diameter are to be cut, and all of the smaller trees are to be left uninjured. This policy will leave the forest worth as much at the end of the twenty years as it is today. So long as the methods are employed it will remain a permanent source of wealth to the owners. If the Northern forests had been handled in this scientific manner no appreciable inroads would have been made into the supply of pine, and no lumber famine would be now showing its fronts over the horizon.
