OUTLOOK GROWS

London, July 24.—The Daily Mails Toyko correspondent sends rather a n alarming view of the situation in the East to his paper.

He says that Russia's retention of Manchuria, the increase of her fleet the dispatch of re-entorcements to Manchuria, the southward movemen t of the occupying army in Manchuria, and the difiant conduct on the Kokean frontier alarmed the Jananese many of whom are convinced that it would be better to fight now than risk the eventual loss of Kokea and the relegation of Japan to secondary place.

He says the Japanese are accumulating stores and negotiating the purchase of ships; that a squadron is off Vladisvostok, to which port Russian vessels have been sent as a precau tion, and that both fleets are ready for action at any moment.

RUSSIAN SPIRIT AGGRESSIVE

He says that a perusal of the Siberian press reveals the aggressive spirit of Russian military party; that the Russians believe they will lose prestige if they give way now, with the result that their far Eastern empire will be lost and Japanese influence wil' become predominant.
