Oklahoma and New Mex= ico Admitted as States.

Arizona Will Remain a Ter-RAILWAY ritory Until Conditions Justity Separate Statehood - Manufacture and Sale of Liquor in Oklahoma Prohibited for Twenty-one Years.

Washington, Feb., 7.-After a field day of brilliant debate and bewildering parliamentary manouvers, marked with much excitement and lasting from boon until 8:50 o'clock tonight without intermission, the Senate passed the House statehood bill in amended form. The bill as passed admits Oklahoma and Indian Ter ritory as a single state and New Mex ico as another, All reference to Arizona was cut from the bill. It now goes to conference, the House having passed it April 19 last.

The proposition to restrict the sale of alcoholic liquors in the territories occupied the Senate for about an hour and three-quarters. As reported by the committee, this limitation was for ten years within Indian Territory, and perpetually in relation to the Indians.

Three Months Railway Accidents Kill 1,032 Persons and Injure 13,207.

The Interstate Commerce Commisson has issue a report on railroad accidents in the United States during the months of July, August and September, 1904, showing 2.28 passengers and 183 employees killed and 2,154 passengers and 1,593 employes injured in train accidents.

Other accidents to passengers and employes, not the result of collissions or derailments, bring the aggregate casualities for the quarter up to 1,032 killed and 13,207 injured.

There were 1,489 collissions and 1,321 derailments, the damage to cars engines and roadway being \$2,439,-

Minister Goes to Manchuria to Sound Japanese. Strug gle Unpopular at Home; People Demand End of it. Tired of Conflict. Press Loses Heart.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 7. Peace sentiment is growing throughout Russia at a rate that alarms the bureaucrats These latter insist that Emp ror Nicholas' oft-repeated de ried to a satisfactory conclusion remains the keynote of the situation.

Despite this insistence, it is apparent that the temper of the people will not much longer tolerate the warwhich has never been popular. The whole present tend of press and public opinion is toward a speedy termination of hostilities, and the de mand is growing so rapidly that officialdom cannot much longer refuse to heed it.

It is in fact, admitted, semi-officially, that Czar Nicholas has already taken cognizance of this demand, and that he may before long intimate a willingness to conclude terms with

M. Admabasa, director of the Committee of the Far East, has been dispatched to Manchuria on an important mission, 'The nature of this, mission is not revealed, but it is believed that M. Admabasa has gone to the theatre of war to report directly to the Emperor whether or not in posible to reach the compromise with Japan without material prejudice to Russia's interests.
