THEODORE PRICE IS NOT COTTON BEAR

Former Norfolk Man Cleared Neary \$1,000,000 During Month of June

New York July 28.—Theodore H. Price, the bull leader, according to the nearly unanimous opinion of the cotton trade, has made, close to \$1,000,000 in the market in the last month. Mr. Price has been carrying from 200,000 to 400,000 bales of cotton and yesterday it is believed he sold about 750,000 bales. Mr. Price has taken occasion to deny that he had turned bear upon the market. While he had sold some cotton, he said, he is still ready to repurchase it on any reasonable decline and believes that the cotton world is facing a comparative crop disaster. "Price has done what practically no other cotton dealer has ever done said one cotton man; he has not overstayed his market. Hardly any one has ever made so much money in short a time and got away with it. Price indignantly denied that he had given a million dollars in cash to his wife.

PRISON BUYS BONDS.

And \$104,100 is Now Salted Down.

Big Gain of over \$20,000 on Sales of Cotton and Other Things Told of at Meeting of State's Prison Directors

The directors of the State's prison were in session at the prison there being present Messrs. J. G. Hackett, of North Wilkesboro, chairman; J. P. Kerr, Asheville; R. H. Speight, of Edgecombe, and W. E. Crosland of Richmond. Mr. John Dawes of Elm City was detained at home by the critical illness of his brother.

The board received the reports of the committee on purchasing State bonds and this was that since the last meeting \$45,000 in North Carolina bonds, due in 1909 and 1910 had been purchased at from 1.02 1-2 to 1.02 3-4 flat these bearing 4 per cent interest. With the purchase the State's prison now has "salted away" \$104,100.

The Wilkesboro-Jefferson Turnpike road was discussed and the report was that this was being pushed forward. On it there are fifty convicts at work. There are now in the prison about 75 convicts, 100 each being with the Raleigh & Southport road and the Raleigh & Pamlico Sound road, 50 in the force at Mount Olive. This force is soon to be withdrawn and the men added to the force with the Raleigh & Southport road. For all these convicts the State receives \$1.25 per day each. There are about 600 convicts in all a large number of these being in the State farm.

The books of the State's prison were examined and all were reported as being in good condition, all the accounts being verified and marked correct.
