The cause of death has not yet been released,


and is pending the results of an autopsy.

A career educator, Parker has worked tirelessly in support of her chosen profession as well.

While her approach has been three-pronged, Parker is best known for her work with the American Cancer Society, and Relay For Life of Bertie County in particular.

"Lucille Bazemore recruited me to be a volunteer for the American Cancer Society," Parker said. "I began volunteering long before there was a Relay For Life."

Parker began working with ACS following the loss of her mother, Mary Parker, to pancreatic cancer.

"After she died, I did volunteer work for hospice, but that wasn't the right fit for me," Parker said. "I'm not a person who can go in there and work one-onone, but I can get on top of a tale and beg for money. In the end, Relay was a better fit.

"That's what I love about Relay For Life - no matter what your personality, there is always a job for you there," she added.

In the fall of 1993, an ACS staff person met with Parker and handed her a red three-ring binder, and asked if Bertie County could hold a Relay For Life.

Commissioners take steps in Sheriff's Office move

WINDSOR - A project well underway.

The Bertie County Commissioners held a special meeting on Friday, Feb. 19 in the commissioners' room.

The Commissioners reviewed the renovations of the old central school office building that will be the new home of the Bertie County Sheriff's

Department. The progress is going well, but not without a large price tag.

The projected cost of the renovation is an estimated \$122,200.

The largest expense is for the auxiliary generator, transfer switch and installation, which have a projected cost of approximately \$45,000.

The expected cost for the security video coverage of all the exterior doors is \$32,000.

The current doors on the building are residential grade and will need to be changed to a commercial metal style. The cost will be around \$10,000 for the replacement of seven doors for security purposes.

It will cost around \$8,000 for the installation of bulletproof glass, a protective metal barrier, and enhanced casings/ moldings in the reception area.

The new magnetic locks will

cost approximately \$3,000 for the building.

The cost of the paint for the building will be about \$3,000, with another \$9,000 for the labor and preparation of the interior rooms.

It will cost about \$6,500 for 430 yards of carpet and 144 yards of linoleum for new floor coverings in the building, along with \$5,500 labor

cer is the name given to cancer of the colon or rectum.

Among cancers that affect both men and women, colorectal cancer is the fourth most common cancer and the second leading cause of cancer deaths in the **United States.**
