Bertie faces return

Black Tent Caterpillar in region

WINDSOR - The Forest Tent Caterpillar is

Bertie County Ranger Mike Hoggard of the N.C. Forest Service said observance of defoliated trees, and concerns from citizens led to a reconnaissance flight.

Two suspects are in custody, one being sought

Bertie County Sheriff John Holley has announced charges for three men in one of the three murders that took place over the course of a week last month.

Sheriff Holley announced two arrests and named one additional suspect in the murder of 19-year-old Shaquan Jamar Taylor in Kelford on April

Dominique Brimley, 19, was arrested and and charged with first-degree murder, felony conspiracy and breaking and entering. He was placed in the Bertie-Martin Regional Jail under no bond.

Following the announce-

De'Andre Rascoe, 19, turned himself in Saturday at the Bertie County Sheriff's Office. He has joined Brimley in the Bertie-Martin Regional Jail, and is also under no bond.

Devonte Holley, 26, is still on the lam, but Sheriff Holley
