WINDSOR - A Windsor man is in jail on multiple assault and drug charges following an incident Dec. 2.

Windsor Police Chief Todd Lane said his officers were dispatched to Pitt Street Friday night after a citizen reported a person at their residence who had a gun and refused to leave.

When officers arrived. the suspect had left the scene, but not before allegedly assaulting and threatening the victim. The victim, however. was able to identify and describe the suspect to officers.
