Bertie-Hertford Foundation awards funds

RALEIGH - The North Carolina Community Foundation is allocating grants from its Disaster Relief Fund to support recovery efforts related to Hurricane Matthew and flooding in affected areas of the state, according to Rodney E. Martin, chair of NCCF's grants committee and statewide board member.

The Bertie-Hertford Community Foundation, a local affiliate of NCCF, has distributed \$10.920 to date. The board directed the grants to:
