Cannabis sativa does not contain tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). THC is the active ingredient that causes one to get "high" when marijuana is smoked or ingested. Hemp may be grown for its fiber and also for the seeds. A farmer could grow hemp and harvest the seeds and then cut down plant for fiber. A double harvest with one planting could help make hemp a cash crop for our region.
