From A1 scene investigation, which included gathering evidence and interviewing witnesses.

Following the investigation, warrants were obtained charging Mitchell, Bazemore and Higgs in the incident.

Warrants drawn charging all three men with discharging a weapon into an occupied dwelling/moving vehicle, felony conspiracy and injury to real property.

Two of the men -Mitchell and Higgs - were arrested in Pitt County on March 28, and are currently being held in the Pitt County Detention Center under a \$370,000 secured bond. Bazemore was arrested in Martin County the same day, and placed in the Bertie-Martin Regional Jail under a \$50,000 secured bond.

Bazemore is slated to make his first appearance in Bertie **County District Court** today (Wednesday) while Mitchell and Higgs will each have their first appearance on April 18.
