WINDSOR - A fifth person will be taking her place on the Windsor Board of Commissioners Tuesday.

Camille Holmes Rascoe was unanimously chosen to succeed the late Lawrence

town board.

# WPD nabs thief

WINDSOR - A Lewiston Woodville man is behind bars charged in multiple break-ins in Windsor.

Windsor Police Chief Justin Jackson said a suspect in multiple vehicle break-ins was identified through video surveillance.

The first reported break-in was Feb. 24 when a homeowner on Pitt Street reported his vehicle had been burglarized. Money and a firearm were reported stolen from the vehicle.

As officers from the Windsor Police Department began investigating the break-in, they found three other vehicles were broken into in the same area, but no items were taken.

Chief Jackson said officers were able to obtain video surveillance in the area of the breakins and identified a suspect. His identity was then confirmed by a member of law enforcement.

Once the subject was identified, Det. Sgt. Jason Thomas drew war-
