Two injured during home invasion

HEXLENA - The Bertie County Sheriff's Office is investigating a home invasion which occurred early Saturday morning.

Bertie County Chief Deputy Kenny Perry said an elderly couple was assaulted in their home after multiple suspects entered the residence after mid-

The case is being investigated as possibly being linked to a similar incident in Hertford County in February.

"We have been in con-

tact with the Hertford County Sheriff's Office and we are sharing information," Chief Deputy Perry said. "With the proximity of the two incidents - both occurring on Early Station Road – and the similarity of the crimes, we are investigating them as if they are linked."

Perry said officers were called to the residence at approximately 2 a.m. and immediately set up a perimeter and searched to see if the suspects were still in the area.

WINDSOR - A man driving with a suspended license found himself in Bertie-Martin Regional Jail last week.

Windsor Police Lt. Frank Ratzlaff said an officer stopped a vehicle because the driver was known not to have a valid license, and found a stolen handgun in the vehicle.

Officer Jessie Mizelle was patrolling June 12 when he saw Jamarr Montel Slade, 31, operating a vehicle though

he was known to have a suspended driver's license.

Officer Mizelle stopped Slade's vehicle just off U.S. 13 in Wind-

During the traffic stop, Officer Mizelle confirmed Slade was on probation, and asked him if there was anything illegal in the vehicle. Slade said there was not and gave consent for the vehicle to be searched.
