Bland wins Kelford seat by a 'lot'

Colerain seat declared vacant by Bertie Co. elections board

KELFORD – The final seat on the Kelford Board of Commissioners has been filled.

Last Friday, the Bertie County Board of Elections met to break a finished deadlocked for the fifth and final seat on the board.

Incumbent Wayne Bland and newcomer Kenneth Ray Cain each finished tied with 23 held Tuesday, Nov. 5.

If there is a tie for the final seat, N.C. General Statutes say the decision is made by casting

Following that pro-

cess, Bland was declared the winner of the fifth seat on the board.

He will join fellow incumbents Wade "Tim" Emory, John "Timmy" Eaton and Jim T. Harrell as those retuning to the board. Newcomer Randy D. Robtoy tie between those who also earned a spot on the town commission, defeating incumbent James H. Bland Jr.

Kelford Mayor Bailey N. Parker was also reelected as he earned 30 of the 40 votes cast votes in the election in the election to outdistance challenger Ahmad Vaughan.

November is set aside as Lung Cancer Awareness Month

RALEIGH - Lung cancer is the nation's leading cause of cancer deaths for both women and men, with 8,010 new diagnoses and 5,370 deaths in North Carolina this year.

In North Carolina, 22 people are diagnosed with lung cancer every

The five-year survival rate is just 18 percent. This rate has changed very little since the 1970s.

November is Lung Awareness Cancer Month, and North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper signed a proclamation for the month.

The 2019 Lung Cancer Proclamation state:

WHEREAS, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death in both men and women in North Carolina and the United States; and

WHEREAS, lung cancer takes the lives of more North Carolinians each year than breast, prostate, colon, liver and kidney cancers combined; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that more than 8,000 North Carolinians will be diagnosed with lung cancer in 2019;

WHEREAS, smoking regardless of history, a person's chance of de-
