The seven branches of the Albemarle Regional Library are open as of yesterday (Wednesday), according to ARL Director Hugh Davis.

While the libraries are open - including the Bertie County Library in Windsor and the Sallie Harrell Jenkins Memorial Library in Aulander - there are new regulations in place.

The new regulations include the requirement of a face covering, the cleaning of hands and a limit on the number of people allowed in the library at one time.

"When patrons come to the library, they are asked to wear a face covering, per the governor's guidelines," Davis
