Bertie County emergency and public safety leaders are urging the public to be prepared and be safe in the event a hurricane strikes the county.

The preparedness is especially important in the wake of the worldwide pandemic of COVID-19, according to Bertie County Emergency Management Director Mitch Cooper.

"This is a new year for us as far as preparing for sheltering," Cooper said. 'We are encouraging people to be prepared to stay in place for 72 hours if they live in a safe structure.


