## BCS will open as all remote

**WINDSOR** – Bertie County Schools will open on Plan C.

Tuesday afternoon, the Bertie County Board of Education approved a recommendation from Superintendent of Schools Dr. Otis Smallwood to open school with remote-only learning for the first nine weeks of school.

The school district

will make provisions for face-to-face learning for certain groups, including those with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), students enrolled in certain career courses with Martin Community College which require labs and select seniors who need to ensure they have credits for graduation.

Last week, N.C. Gov. Roy Cooper announced

### COVID-19 cases rise in Bertie Co.

WINDSOR – Bertie County's cases of COVID-19 have risen significantly over the last week.

In the past seven days, Bertie County has added 24 new COVID-19 cases just when it seemed the cases were

starting to disappear.

On Tuesday of last week, Bertie County had 157 total cases, only three of which were active. A week later that number has soared to 181 and there are 24 active cases.

## 'Freedom of North Carolina' films at Hope Plantation

WINDSOR — It's take two for an independent film that began shooting again last weekend after being delayed for months by COVID-19.

"Freedom of North Carolina" tells the story of a family escaping slavery in 19th century eastern North Carolina.
