Bertie officials: Time to pay the bill

More than 800 in danger of disconnection

WINDSOR - The time has come to pay the bill.

Bertie County officials have made multiple atmore than 800 water customers who are delinquent on their accounts, but only a fraction of that number have made contact to resolve the

Bertie County Water Detempts to help alleviate the partment Director Ricky

Spivey appeared at Monday's Bertie County Commissioners meeting to detail the attempts made to reach those who are behind on their water bills. Spivey said each customer has received a letter, *notices have been

placed in the Bertie Ledger-Advance and on Facebook. and notes went home at the bottom of each water bill.

Despite those attempts to reach the 846 people who are delinquent on their bills due to COVID-19, only 30 have responded and just 11 of those have signed paperwork to execute a payment

N.C. Gov. Roy Cooper and Attorney General Josh Stein put a moratorium in place on shutoffs of water due to COVID-19 job losses. That moratorium stayed in place until the end of July.

EDENTON — Six area school districts and two public charter schools will split \$500,000 in Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Secu-

rity Act funding allocated by

the N.C. General Assembly.

State Rep. Ed Goodwin, R-Chowan, held a press conference with officials from the districts and schools to announce the \$500,000 CARES allocation. Most said they plan to use the funding to expand access for students to

broadband internet service. The districts receiving CARES Act funding include Bertie County Schools, \$107,712; Camden County Schools, \$98,702; Edenton-Chowan Schools, \$99,645; Perquimans County Schools, \$82,529; Washington County Schools, \$68,258; and the Tyrrell County Schools, \$34,028

Also receiving CARES funding are two charter schools: Three Rivers Academy in Bertie, \$3,961; and The Po-Innovative Center, cosin

allocations based on each district's or school's average daily enrollment.

"This money... is a significant appropriation for our schools and the students,"
