Senator-elect must resign before oath

WINOSOR - A Bertie County Commissioner has been elected to the North Carolina Senate.

Ernestine Byrd Bazemore was



elected earlier this month to represent District 3 in the North Carolina State Sen-

ate. The two-term commissioner won with 52 percent of the vote over Vance County Commissioner Thomas Hester.

The question for many citizens has been, what happens next?

N.C. General Statute 128-1 makes it illegal for a person to hold two elected positions of public trust in North Carolina, meaning Bazemore will need to resign her seat on the Bertie County Commission before taking the oath of office in January.

Bazemore acknowledged in the November meeting of the Bertie commissioners that she intended to resign and give ample opportunity for her replacement to be named and seated.

Once Bazemore resigns, the party of which she is a member - in this case the Democratic Party - will
