# Two more succumb to COVID

### Bertie County's active cases still exceed 100

County lost two more residents to COVID-19, Regional Albemarle Health Services (ARHS) announced Monday.

# BCC receive

WINDSOR - The First Colony Foundation believes it has found artifacts in its latest digs in Bertie County that could be associated with the Roanoke Colonists.

Nicholas Luccketti, the principal investigator, appeared before the Bertie County Board of Commissioners Dec. 7 to give a report on the latest dig on the site the county owns, which

is referred to as Site Y by the Foundation, but is commonly referred to as the Tall Glass of Water site.

The dig was conducted this past summer, and full investigation of the results is ongoing, but Luccketti said the site in the top right quadrant featured artifacts from the late 16th century or early 17th century.

"We did find artifacts that clearly could be

### Electoral College confirms Biden win

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Electoral College decisively confirmed Joe Biden as the nation's next president, ratifying his November victory in an authorita-

tive state-by-state repudiation

of President Donald Trump's refusal to concede he had lost.

The presidential electors on Monday gave Biden a solid majority of 306 electoral votes to Trump's 232, the same margin that Trump bragged was a landslide when he won the White House four years ago.

Heightened security was in place in some states as electors met to cast paper ballots, with masks, social distancing and other pandemic precautions the order of the day. The results will be sent to Washington and
