BCSO charges one, more arrests likely

POWELLSVILLE - The first in what will likely be multiple suspects has been arrested and charged in a November 2016 breaking and entering in Powellsville.

Bertie County Sheriff John Holley said Travis Donte Smallwood was charged Tuesday, March 2 in connection with the incident after an investigation that included the Bertie County Sheriff's Office, Hertford County Sheriff's Office, Ahoskie Police Department, Down East Drug Task Force and the N.C. State Bureau of Investigation.


