

ARHS to change model

Nearly half of service area is vaccinated

WINDSOR - Albemarle Regional Health Services is switching models after this week.

The regional health coalition, which includes the Bertie County Health Department, will end the mass clinics for COVID-19 vaccinations and move to appointment-only model based at the local health centers.

"All first doses of the vaccine are already by appointment," said ARHS Health Director Battle Betts, MPA. "We have daytime and evening time appointments.'

The likely final mass vaccination was held Wednesday evening.

Betts said so far, about half of the ARHS service area - which includes Bertie, Chowan, Hertford, Perquimans, Pasquotank, Gates, Currituck and Camden
