tion's approval of the funds from the state Department of Public Instruction in Raleigh. He added that Bertie County Schools already have a plan in place once the supplement is approved.

"This plan of giving a bonus for all their hard work is just a drop in the bucket for what they really deserve," Smallwood said after the meeting. "We wanted to make sure we treated everybody equitable, that's why we wanted a straight flat-rate across the board because everybody has worked hard for this and no one harder than the other."

The superintendent stated that full-time employees who were hired from the first 30 days will receive the full amount of \$2,000.

Employees hired after the first 30 days up to April 1 will have their stipend prorated and if they were hired as of April 1 until now, or are no

longer employed within the district, they would not longer be eligible.

"This is totally contingent on DPI approving our federal plan for this money, so once they approve it and get it released then we can make sure everybody gets paid," Smallwood said.

He noted that Bertie County was not alone, in that several other counties in the region were considering a similar plan pending approval by their various Boards of

Education.

"Everybody will receive it," he noted. "Each principal, each teacher, bus driver, cafeteria worker, Central Office employee - everybody from the first 30 days through now."

The board thanked Dr. Smallwood and his staff for their insight.

"We thank everyone for all they did because their work did not go unnoticed," said Board Chair Tarsha Dudley. "This is an excellent opportunity to give back to everyone who made sure our children were educated."

"We got thrown into a game where there was no playbook," said board member Norman Cherry. "It was just - BAM! - there was no way to decide how to do what. So we wrote the book as we went along, and it appears we're winning the game."


