Wells received the Aubrey Lee Brooks Scholarship for the upcoming 2021-2022 academic school year.

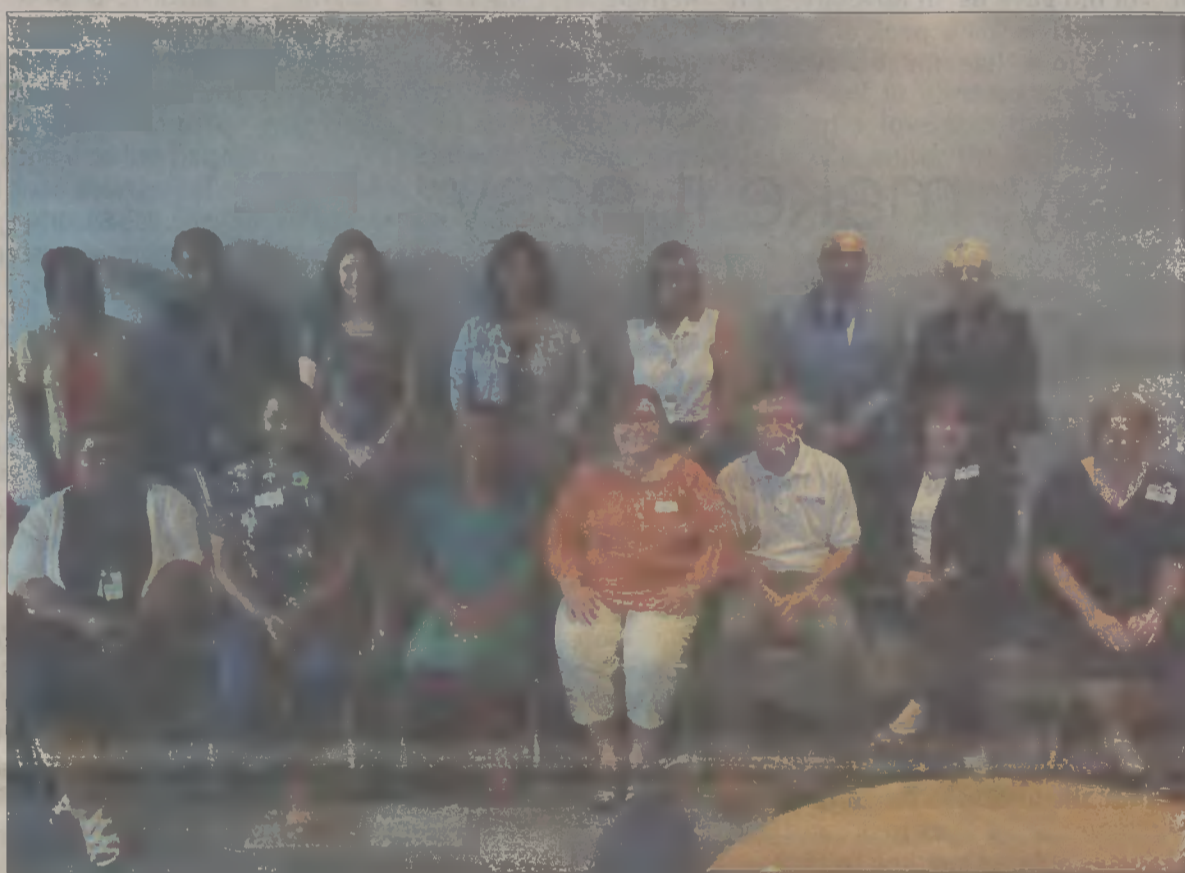
Wells is a graduate from Bertie Early College and plans to attend North Carolina State University.

The North Carolina Aquariums are asking teachers to take a few minutes to apply for this year's Aquarium Scholars Grant helping to bring the beach within reach.

Applications are now available for the 2021-2022 Aquarium Scholars Grant Program.

Aquarium Scholars offers funding for Title I schools to help remove barriers that may hinder educational opportunities with the aquariums. More than \$120,000 in mini grants will be awarded to help with trip costs, transportation fees and other needs.
