Write-in candidates played a major part in several municipal elections following the certification of results last week.

Colerain, Kelford and Roxobel all had write-ins win seats on the town board. In Roxobel, a write-in winner caused a tie between two candidates on the ballot, resulting in a coin toss to declare a winner. Write-in candidate Sharon Jones received 38 votes to claim a seat on the town board alongside Robert Phelps (44 votes) and Joseph Pittman (39). That left Johnna Browne Lewis and Dillon Pruden tied with 30 votes each. A coin toss was held at the Bertie County Board of Elections, which was won by Pruden making him the fourth and final commissioner.
