GEORGE WASHINGTON

George Washington was born on Friday, Feb. 22, 1732, and died on Saturday, Dec. 14, 1799, at 10:20 p. m. He was a man of powerful physique, being sir feet and two inches in height, with eyes of blue and sandy hair. When 40 years of age he weighed 210 pounds.

Washington's father, Augustine Washington, was married twice; and it was his second wife. Mary Ball, who was the mother of George. George was born at Wakefield, on the Botamac, 50 miles below Mount Vernon. His parents moved to Mount Vernon in 1735; at that time this location was called Hunting Creek.

On January 6, 1759, Washington married Mrs. Daniel Parks Custis who before her first marriage was a Dandridge. Mrs. Martha Custis was the mother of four children. 
