## MACON DAIRY GETS WRITE-UP

### Asheville Paper Carries Story of Crawford Dairy

The following story about Gilmer Crawford's dairy, one of the most modern in Western North Carolina, appeared on the Farm Page in Monday's issue of The Asheville Citizen:

The Meadow Land Farm dairy owned and operated by Gilmer Crawford one mile west of here is an example of how modern methods pay in this industry. Mr. Crawford is the only son of the late Lee Crawford, at one time president of the Macon county bank, (Bank of Franklin).

A herd of twenty milkers, Guernsey and Holsteins, may be seen feeding in a rolling meadow surrounded on all sides by forest covered mountains and the long level of the meadow cut through by three clear brooks from gushing springs at the foot of these mountains.

The dairy was built by state specifications, inspected and approved by state inspectors.

There are three square feet of light to each station, and 500 cubic feet of air. Automatic drinking cup of pure mountain water to each station. The milking barn with concrete floor is scoured after each milking. The walk way, bottling room, milking barn all have concrete floors and are screened.

**Milked By Machinery**  
The cows are milked with a milking machine. The milk is first filtered, then cooled, bottled and capped, all by sanitary machinery and delivered in an ice cooled compartment.

Each cow has been inspected for tuberculosis. Each helper has a health certificate from a doctor, and every one working about the dairy is dressed in white.

The engine for heating water for sterilizing is fifty feet from the dairy building.

Chocolate drinks, made from whole milk are served each day to the school children, 1-2 pint for

5 cents.  
Products from the dairy are: Whole milk, skimmed milk, cream, cottage cheese, chocolate milk and butter milk.  
The hotels and eating places of Franklin serve this grade "A" milk, otherwise they do not get a grade A rating by the state.

### Raises His Feed

All dairy feed, except cottonseed meal and bran, are raised on the Meadow Land farm.

Crops are rotated, early rye, giving place for corn and other roughness.

Each cow's record is kept and she is fed according to the amount of milk and butter fat she produces.

These improvements have all been made for grade A milk within the last twelve months and Macon county is, indeed proud of its first clean dairy situated on the lovely old Crawford farm.

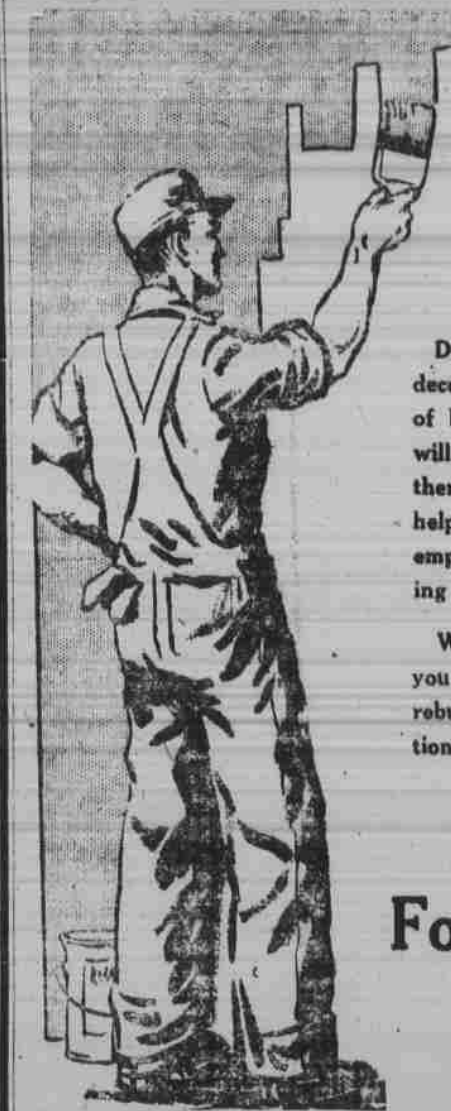
