tion by the Presbytery of resolutions "heartily condemning" an editorial which appeared last week in The Franklin Press, Macon county weekly newspaper, branding Dr. Campbell as the "self-appointed Presbyterian pope of Western North Carolina."

Text of Resolution

"The resolutions adopted on the Franklin Press editorial read as follows:

"Resolved, that the Asheville Presbytery heartily condemns the editorial in the Franklin Press, April 7, 1932, entitled, 'Our Presbyterian Pope,' in which Dr. Campbell is represented as acting the part of a pope in the Presbytery. The Presbytery is too much a lover of liberty to tolerate the dominance of any man. And, Dr. Campbell is too Christlike-humble, gentle and sweet-spirited to ever be thought of as lording it over anybody. We understand that the editor of the said paper is a young man who has a good deal to learn; but we take this action lest there go abroad a false impression of this Presbytery and of one of its ministers."

(EDITOR'S NOTE: - The Franklin Press' editorial calling Dr. Campbell the "self-appointed Presbyterian pope of Western North Carolina," was prompted by the repeated attempts of Dr. Campbell to frustrate the efforts of friends of Maxwell Home to raise money for its support, even while the home was still operating under authority from the Presbytery. The particular occasion was a statement made by Dr. Campbell to The Asheville Citizen that there must have been an "error" in the allotment to Maxwell Home of \$390 from the Duke Endowment Fund.)
