

Executive Department STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA A Proclamation by the Governor \$100.00 REWARD

Whereas, official information has been received at this Department that J. R. BELL late of the County of Macon, stands charged with murder and burglary AND WHEREAS, it appears that the said J. R. BELL has fled the State, or so conceals himself that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J. C. B. Ehringhaus, Governor of the State of North Carolina, by virtue of authority in me vested by law, do issue this my PROCLAMATION, offering a reward of ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) Dollars for the apprehension and delivery of the said J. R. Bell to the Sheriff of Macon County at the Courthouse in Franklin and I do enjoin all officers of the State and all good citizens to assist in bringing said criminal to justice. This offer of reward remains in force for six months from this date.

Done at our City of Raleigh, the 6th day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and 33 and in the one hundred and 57th year of our American Independence.
