11/2 cups pumpkin (cooked) 1 teaspoon vanilla

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon ginger 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon 1 teaspoon lemon extract

21/2 cups flour

4 teaspoons baking powder 1 cup raisins

1 cup chopped nut meats · Cream sugar and shortening; add eggs, pumpkin and seasonings. Sift flour and baking powder, combine with sugar mixture. Add fruit and nuts and blend thoroughly. Drop from teaspoon on a well greased baking sheet. Bake 15 minutes in a moderate oven. Three dozen

Mix and sift flour, salt sugar and baking powder. Cut in the shortening. Add the pumpkin and mix well. Add milk. Roll out on a well floured board. Cut with biscuit cutter and place on a greased baking sheet. Bake in a hot oven fifteen or twenty minutes.

11/2 cups cooked pumpkin

cggs 1 cup milk

1/2 teaspoon salt If pumpkin is watery, cook slowly until most of the water has evaporated. Add beaten eggs and milk. Combine sugar, spices and salt and add to pumpkin mixture. Pour into pie pan lined with pastry. Bake in a hot oven for 5 minutes to set crust, then cook in slow oven until firm. Do not allow to reach boiling temperature.
