Higher Prices Paid For Storage Apples

Apples kept in storage until Christmas or later will bring more than those sold in mid-season when marketing is heavy.

H. R. Niswonger, extension horticulturist at State college, urges orchardists to prepare storage places where they can keep a part of their crop for the late market.

When kept in well ventilated storage where the temperature is between 32 and 40 degrees fahrenheit, apples, particularly the late varieties, will be in good condition in January.

Let the fruit cool off as much as possible before putting it in the storage room, Niswonger said. Warm apples are likely to sweat and lose their keeping qualities if put directly into storage.

Grade the apples and put them in barrels, boxes, or loose-slatted of trust: crates. The containers should be stacked in such a way that the regular floor will improve circula-

Any means of insulating the store room to keep the apples cool on warm days and to protect them from freezing in cold weather will add to the value of the storage place, Niswonger continued.

The roof especially should be well insulated, as much heat can leak in or out through a thin, carelessly built roof.

This is a factor often overlooked in converting the cellar of a house

Picking should be delayed as long as the fruit is holding on to the tree well or until there is danger of freezing, cautioned Niswonger.

Offers Recipe For Making Damson Jam

Delicious jam can be made from the damsons ripening over North Carolina, according to Mrs. C. Morris, State college extension economist in food conservation.

She offers a few suggestions for the farm housewife who would like to convert some of her damsons into jam:

Wash the fruit and pick off the

To remove seeds, place a small quantity of damsons in a colander and lower into hot water. Allow them to heat slowly. Press out the seeds and remove. Keep water over a slow fire until all are seeded.

At least three-fourths of the fruit should be fully ripe to give the jam good flavor and color. One-fourth should be slightly under ripe to give the finished product a good consistency.

Use three-fourths pound of sugar for each pound of fruit. Put fruit late of Macon county, N. C., this Ledford, R. M., 1 lot2.06 Colored: burning.

Mash the sugar and fruit with a wooden spoon or bat. Cook slowly day of July, 1938, or this notice Mashburn, E. A. Estate, 1 lot 5.77 until the fruit becomes a smooth, thick mass.

The temperature of the jam when finished will range from 221 to 225 degrees fahrenheit, or 105 to 106 degrees centigrade, depending upon the condition of the fruit used.

After the jam has been cooked, it should be poured immediately J29-6tp-S2

into hot, sterilized jars. Seal the jars and process them for five minutes at a temperature of 180 degrees fahrenheit.
