NEW HOME OF BURRELL MOTOR COMPANY

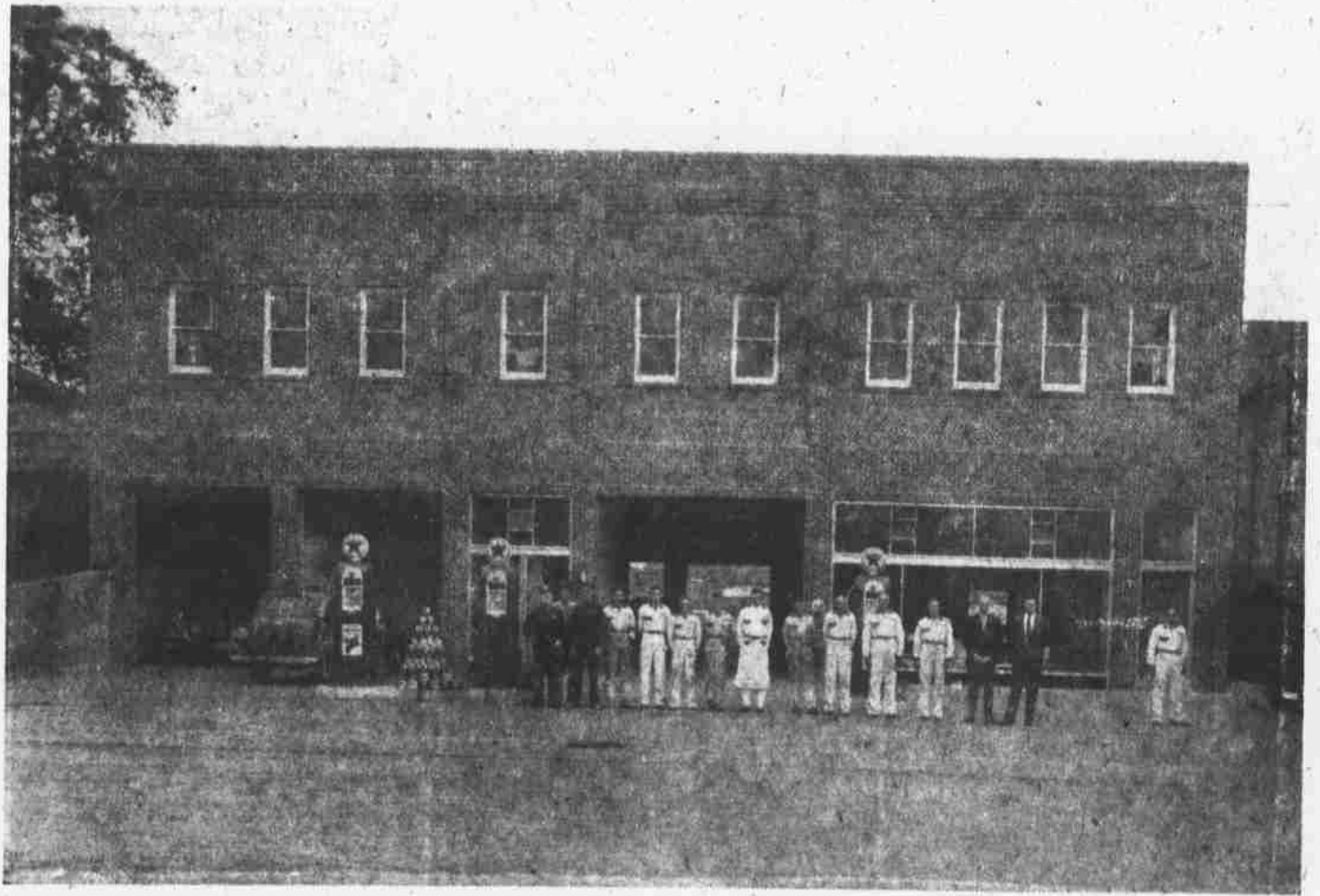
