On motion duly seconded, all members voting in the affirmative, the following Bond Orders were passed, this being the final passage thereof:

ORDERED that bonds of Franklin Township shall be issued to the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$81,000 for the purpose of refunding the following bonds which are hereby determined to represent a valid indebtedness of the township incurred before July 1, 1933:

\$28,000 6 per cent Road Bonds, dated April 1, 1914, payable April 1, 1944.

\$53,000 6 per cent Road Bonds, dated August 1, 1914, payable August 1, 1944.

\$34,000 5 per cent School Funding Bonds dated January 1, 1928, payable January 1, \$2,000 in 1933 to 1935, \$3,000 in 1936, \$2,000 in 1937, \$5,000 in 1938, \$5,000 in 1940 and 1941, \$3,000 in 1942 and \$5,000 in 1943.

\$39,000 6 per cent School Building Bonds dated February 1, 1922, payable February 1, \$2,000 in 1934 to 1945 and \$2,500 in 1946 to 1951.
