

DEATH CLAIMS B. W. BREEDLOVE

Old Citizen Of County Dies At Home Of Son

Benjamin Watkins Breedlove, 78, died at the home of his son, Cleve Breedlove, in the Tellico section of Macon county, Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock. Death was caused from mastoiditis following pneumonia.

Mr. Breedlove, a farmer and timberman, was born on Wizzard creek in Swain county and later moved to this county, where he is widely known. He was the son of the late Jesse Breedlove. He was a member of the Burningtown Baptist church.

Funeral services were held at the Oak Grove Baptist church Thursday morning at 10 o'clock. The Rev. Columbus Welch, a Baptist minister, was in charge of the services. Interment was in the church cemetery.

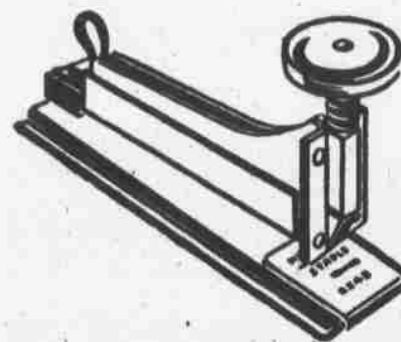
Boy Injured By Fall Into Mill Pond

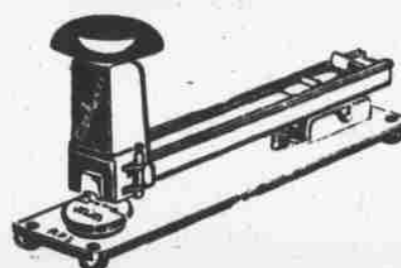
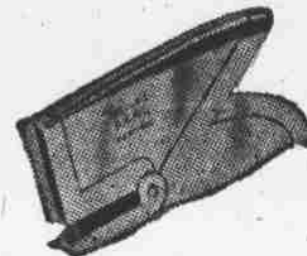
